P is similar to the corresponding portion of B, with the exception that stroke 3 in P is a trifle below the middle. Stroke 5 is first made vertical and straight and then rounded at each end into 4. B. The lower lobe is about i unit wider than the upper. Strokes and 7 are made straight verticals at first and then rounded into 4 and 5; but these two stems must be joined by hairlines. This remark applies also to the R following. The effect of running the two curved stems together is shown in the first B, and is a mistake commonly made. D. Its width is determined as in all the previous letters, by first drawing a square and reducing this by the correct amount. Make stroke 4 a vertical...
